Use this booklet as a guide to assist you with making purchases at UUCV's 2019 Auction, our biggest fundraiser of the year. We encourage you to be as generous with your bread as your budget allows. Feel free to dress up in your 1969 threads, kick back and have an outtasight time!

### SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

**6:30 p.m.** – Doors are open for registration, and there's no mud to trek through to enter! Check in and get your bidding number, and then go hang out in the very groovy social hall. There you'll find many beautiful people eying up the offerings that will blow your mind. Start bidding on Gift Certificates, Personal Services, Homemade Goodies and the Wishing Well while you dig the tunes of Brian McPherson and the UUCV Rock 'n' Rollers.

7-7:15 p.m. — STAGE ONE PEACE SIGN-UPS WILL BE OPEN. Go ahead and write your name down for the events of your choice. Note: If there are more people who sign up than spaces allotted, names will be drawn at 7:20 to determine the winning participants and/or couples.

Keep bidding on the Gift Certificates, Services and Goodies, and particularly those on pink sheets. If you didn't yet get a raffle ticket, you can do so until 8:35.

7:35-7:50 p.m. - STAGE TWO LOVE SIGN-UPS WILL BE OPEN. As with all of the Sign-Ups—if the event is oversold, names will be drawn five minutes later (7:55 p.m.) to determine the winning participants/couples.

Time to make your final bids on offerings on pink sheets, as they will close out at 8. All of the rest of the silent items, including the Wishing Well, Gift Certificates and Personal Services will close out at 8:15, so keep up the bidding (since, remember, this IS a fundraiser!) Groove to the music and do your thing at the beverage and food stands.

8:10-8:30 p.m. - STAGE THREE MUSIC SIGN-UPS WILL BE OPEN. Don't miss out! If you haven't filled up your social calendar, now is the time. Names will be drawn for any oversold events at 8:35. Also, 8:35 is the last opportunity to purchase your raffle ticket.

8:45 pm. - RAFFLE DRAWING If your ticket is chosen and you are there, you'll double your dough! Far out!

8:50 p.m. - CHECK-OUT will begin in the sanctuary soon after, progressing from the front rows to the back. Feel free to get another beverage or snack or just cool it and enjoy the music of Brian and the UUCV Rock 'n' Rollers, socialize with friends, and eventually truck into in the sanctuary while the Check-out Establishment gets all the records compiled. And, yes, you CAN trust the man (and the woman).

### **AUCTION BASICS**

**REGISTRATION:** A \$10 per person suggested entrance fee includes a bidder number and snack buffet. Receive your bidder number from the Check-in Establishment. All purchases except for beverages from the bar must be made with your bidder number. (Note: If you need to leave early, this might be the time to complete the special authorization form. See "Paying for your Purchases" for more details.)

**BIDDING BUDDIES:** If you are unable to attend, we encourage you to locate a friend to bid on your behalf. Make sure they have your method of payment. Another option is to simply write a check to "UUCV" with "Auction 2019" in the memo line to support our beloved community.

PAYING FOR YOUR PURCHASES: Several options are available! After the records are compiled on Auction night, the Check-out Establishment will accept cash, VISA, MasterCard, Discover or checks made out to UUCV. If you need to leave early, complete the form offered at Check-in. This form will allow you to make your payment the next day after services OR have UUCV bill your credit card and email you a receipt. For your convenience, these forms will also be available at the Advance Registration Table prior to the Auction but will not be accepted until the night of the Auction. Or, as noted above, tell your Bidding Buddy your bidder number and your method of payment. Upon receipt of your payment, you'll receive a listing of all of the items you purchased to retain for your reference, and UUCV will also retain a copy.

**RAFFLE:** Raffle tickets in the amounts of \$5 through \$25 will be sold during the evening and the winning ticket will be drawn the night of the Auction. The winner will get double the percentage if present and the face amount if not. For example, a \$15 ticket will garner 30% of the total collected if the winner is still there, and 15% if not.

**REFRESHMENTS:** A selection of delicious hors d'oeuvres and sweets donated by UUCV members and friends will be available throughout the evening. Also available for a cash donation at the bar throughout the evening will be beer, wine, bottled water and soft drinks.

**SIGN-UP ITEMS:** Sign-ups will take place from 7–8:30; they have a fixed price and a set number of openings. List your bidding number for as many places as you desire for each, i.e., for a couple, write your bidding number twice. Sign-ups will be presented in three stages. Note: If there are more people who sign up for an event than the spaces allotted, names will be drawn after each stage to determine the winning participants and/or couples.

OTHER ITEMS: Bidding on Personal Services, Homemade Goodies, Wishing Well Items and Gift Certificates runs from 6:30–8:15. Items displayed with PINK bidding sheets will close out early to allow data processing to begin. Each bidding sheet will indicate the catalog number of the item, name of the item and minimum bid. Write your bidder number and the amount you are bidding in even dollar amounts directly below the existing bid. Bid as often as you like and, remember, all funds go to UUCV! When the emcee announces bidding is closed, the highest bidder's number will be posted on the actual item or paper describing the item. If you are the winning bidder for an item, please take it home with you after you check out.

**CHILDREN'S AUCTION ACTIVITIES:** The Auction isn't only for adults. Children will be cared for downstairs in the elementary classrooms during the Auction. They will have their own Kids' Auction with a chance to purchase non-food items for kids ages 4 and up with their "Auction Bucks." Nursery care is also provided by reservation.




